

Our LUNG PRE-TRANSPLANT NURSE COORDINATORS (80% - 100% position) are responsible for the pre-transplant continuum of care for lung transplant patients at the University of Washington Medical Center, Seattle. The role includes independent patient assessment, triage, education, coordination of medical/nursing care and documentation of care from referral through transplant phases of care, as well as donor procurement call. This role may include post-transplant coverage. An understanding of the regulations and data requirements surrounding transplant care provided by the United Network of Organ Sharing and HRSA is important.

Our Lung Transplant program is one of the largest in North America, providing lung transplant care for the entire Pacific Northwest. Through the dedicated work of our team, we have transplanted more than 1000 recipients. Patient survival and quality of life are superior.
