Our Director of Transplant Programs will oversee the strategic and operational aspects of the various transplant specialties and will have a focus on building and fostering strong physician relations and staff engagement. This position has management oversight of 85 FTEs across the various transplant specialties. The director role will be responsible for planning, organizing, directing and controlling the daily operations of the transplant programs at UF Health Shands and will be expected to provide leadership and management of the transplant programs with accountability for all aspects of planning, development, marketing and management of financial operations and personnel resources for transplant services. The Clinical Transplant Coordinator is a professional designated member of the transplant health care team who will be assigned primary responsibility for coordinating clinical aspects of care. The coordinator will work with patients and their families beginning with the evaluation for transplantation and continue through and after transplantation, in a compassionate and tactful manner in order to facilitate access to and provide continuity of care. The coordinator will also work with other members of the transplant team, including physicians, surgeons, nurses, social workers, financial coordinators, and administrative personnel at the transplant program. The Clinical Transplant Coordinator performs independently and seeks support/direction as needed. The Clinical Transplant Coordinator must be able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills necessary to provide care appropriate to the age of their patients; demonstrate knowledge of growth and development; assess data reflective of patients status; and identify each patients requirements relative to age specific needs.

Education

Bachelor's degree in Nursing is required.

Experience

Generally requires 3 to 5 years of related experience.

License/Certification

- Valid Florida RN license is required.
- American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers certification with at least 6 months validity required.

Description: In coordination with transplant physicians and surgeons, The Transplant Coordinator - RN provides care to transplant recipients and live donors throughout all phases of transplantation or donation including evaluation, pre-transplant/donation, the transplant/donation surgery and post-transplant/donation. Serves as the primary contact for patients; provides ongoing education to the patient, monitors the patient status throughout the process and coordinates care with all members of the transplant team. Ensures that the responsibilities associated with the role coordinator are carried out in a manner that meets all regulatory requirements for a transplant program. Training, evaluation and competencies for this role are overseen by a Nurse Leader to the department.

Required Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in Nursing required.
- License Registered Nurse required., and Certificate 1 Basic Life Support required.
- 3-5 years related work experience required.

Essential Responsibilities:

- Coordinates information from referring physician, testing and clinic visits required for potential transplant recipient and living donor as defined in clinical pathways.
- Provides educational information to recipients, donors, primary caregivers regarding all aspects of transplantation/donation including pre-transplant, operative procedure, post-operative management and monitoring, long term follow-up and research protocols.
- Participates in the medical and surgical outpatient clinics with the collaborating physicians and surgeons; reviews outpatient lab values and testing results; works with physician/surgeon as needed to adjust care plan.
- Coordinates and facilitates discharge planning with in-patient team to maintain continuity of care.
- Provides accurate, appropriate and timely documentation to meet state and federal regulatory requirements.

Transplant coordinators coordinate solid organ (liver, kidney, pancreas and multi-organ) transplantation of all pediatric and adult organ recipients. The transplant coordinator is a primary member of a multidisciplinary team responsible to coordinate the care of transplant patients and provides follow-up and care throughout the continuum of care including pre-transplant, transplant admission and post-transplant phases. You will educate patients, families and other care givers to the unique aspects of transplantation including; organ donation, pre transplant care, peri transplant care and post-transplant / follow up care. You will serve as a clinician, educator, investigator, consultant and leader, and you will make clinical judgments based on a synthesis of current research, concepts, principles, theories and outcomes to solve complex problems.
