Transplant Coordinators are specialized nurses, typically in an outpatient/ambulatory care setting, that facilitate the care and education of solid organ (e.g., heart, lung, heart-lung, liver, kidney, pancreas, small intestine, and multi-organ transplantation), blood and bone marrow (BMT), or stem cell transplant recipients and their families from initial contact, through the work-up for transplant and the waiting period, discharge planning, and then post-transplant follow-up for transplant-related care, ensuring continuity of care across the transplant continuum. Transplant Coordinators also participate in coordinating retrieval of cadaveric organs for transplantation and participating in providing educational/outreach programs regarding organ donation and transplantation to health care providers, patient groups, community organizations, and others in the hospital's service area. The Transplant Coordinator is an integral member of a larger interdisciplinary team contributing to excellence in patient care, research, teaching, and in providing leadership to the organization.

Minimum Qualifications

Education: Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from an accredited college or university

Position Summary

The Clinical Transplant Coordinator is a professional designated member of the transplant health care team who will be assigned primary responsibility for coordinating clinical aspects of care. The coordinator will work with patients and their families beginning with the evaluation for transplantation and continue through and after transplantation, in a compassionate and tactful manner in order to facilitate access to and provide continuity of care. The coordinator will also work with other members of the transplant team, including physicians, surgeons, nurses, social workers, financial coordinators, and administrative personnel at the transplant program. The Clinical Transplant Coordinator performs independently and seeks support/direction as needed. The Clinical Transplant Coordinator must be able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills necessary to provide care appropriate to the age of their patients; demonstrate knowledge of growth and development; assess data reflective of patients status; and identify each patients requirements relative to age specific needs.

Education

Bachelor's degree in Nursing is required.

Experience

Generally requires 3 to 5 years of related experience.

License/Certification

- Valid Florida RN license is required.
- American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers certification with at least 6 months validity required.
- Must meet and maintain valid and current all unit specific and organizational skills/competencies, certifications/licensures, as required by regulatory and/or nursing standard of practice for the specialty.
